- Most tours operate rain or shine. If your tour is cancelled because of weather, your onboard SeaPass® account will be fully refunded.
- Once you purchase your shore excursion online, you will receive a confirmation via e-mail. After you board your ship for your cruise, your excursion tickets will be delivered to your stateroom. Again, please verify meeting time and location as some tours meet in a lounge area on the ship and some at the pier.
- If you wish to cancel your tour prior to the sailing, you can do so online up to 2 days prior to the sail date. Your credit card will be automatically refunded.

Booking Onboard:

There are three ways to book your excursions onboard the ship:

- Visit the Shore Excursions desk
- Fill out the order form in your stateroom
- Use the Interactive TV system, available on most ships

The cost of the excursion will be charged to your SeaPass® account, for which you will be registered when you check in online or at the pier, prior to boarding the ship. All tour purchases will be reflected on your SeaPass® account.

Tour Pricing:

Shore Excursions are priced per person in the specific country's local currency. Gratuity:
